The regular meeting of The Hague Town Board was held Tuesday, August 13, 2019 at The Hague Community Center at 6:00 pm with the following members present:

On a Motion made by M. Fitzgerald, seconded by J. Bast, to open the meeting at 6:00 pm to audit bills. All voted aye. Motion carried.

<u>PUBLIC HEARING</u> Waste Water Variance, Connors Tax Map # 2-1-25

On a Motion made by J. Patchett, seconded by M. Fitzgerald, to open the public hearing. All voted aye. Motion carried.

Tony DeFranco, Licensed Professional Engineer, represented Doug & Pam Connors for the design of a replacement wastewater system. Mr. DeFranco had made adjustments to the design presented at the last Town Board meeting, July 9, 2019. The setback to water source was increased from 32.79' to 46.28'. Thus the setback to the jurisdictional wetland needed to be adjusted as well from 72.72' to 71.85'. The Board discussed the conditions to be set with Mr. DeFranco. Reminder letters will be sent to the homeowner annually for submission of the required inspection to the Town of Hague.

On a Motion made by M. Fitzgerald, seconded by J. Bast, to close the public hearing. All voted aye. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

RESOLUTION # 95 OF 2019 RESOLUTION TO APPROVE CONNORS WASTE WATER VARIANCE

WHEREAS, the Town Board acting as the Local Board of Health of the Town of Hague held a public hearing on the 13th day of August regarding three Waste Water Variances for a replacement system for Doug and Pam Connors whose property is located at 911 New Hague Road, Tax Map # 2-1-25, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has implemented the following conditions:

- 1. Due to the possibility of flooding/saturation of the Puraflo pods with heavy water use, a water shut-off valve must be installed on the water pump.
- 2. Testing system (effluent) after the first month of use and annual inspection results be sent to the Town thereafter due to the 71.85' separation to a jurisdictional wetland.
- 3. UV/Chlorinator water filter will be installed on spring in the basement due to the 46.28' setback to the leach system.

Resolution introduced by S. Ramant, and seconded by M. Fitzgerald, VARIANCE #1 IS RESOLVED, for the setback of septic tanks to property line: Code 10', Design -10'

WELCOME GUESTS/PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Barbara Hayes Trainor, of Ticonderoga, spoke about the conditions of the Hague Cemetery, located at the corner of Rt. 8 and W. Hague Road. Ms. Trainor has several relatives at rest at the cemetery. She expressed that the poor conditions of the grounds became apparent to her when she went to visit her grandparents on Memorial Day Weekend. Several headstones were found damaged and lying flat on the ground. She does not recall so many of the stones being in that condition the year prior, which leads her to question possible vandalism. Ms. Trainor brought photographs to share with the Town Board. She expressed that this cemetery holds some of the earliest settlers of the Town of Hague and she feels that it should be taken better care of. Alice Patchett, of Hague, also spoke regarding the conditions of the cemetery. She recommended the formation of a Cemetery Committee. Supervisor Frasier suggested that Mrs. Patchett could head up the Committee. Mrs. Patchett stated that the project would be better for the Hague Historical Society. Councilman Fitzgerald stated that it may be best to leave the fallen stones on the ground as trying to lift them could cause more damage. He also stated that repairs would be an expensive proposition. Sally DeLarm Rypkema, the Town of Hague Historian, mentioned that grant money may be available. The Hague Historical Society will look into grant funding.

Marylou Doulin, of Hague, asked if the Town of Hague could consider reopening the landfill for leaves. Supervisor Frasier stated that the town landfill cannot accept leaves per NYSDEC. Ms. Doulin expressed her concerns about the leaves going into the lake and that the decomposing leaves makes the sand mucky, which creates perfect conditions for invasive species. She suggested a composting system. Councilman Fitzgerald states that residents can create their own private composting, but the town cannot.

Alice Patchett spoke regarding weeds growing in the cracks between the roads and the sidewalks in the hamlet. Mrs. Patchett believes this should be a Highway Department responsibility to maintain because it on the roads. She suggested that bed tax funds could be used toward the cleanup as it is "Town Beautification". ZEO Clark mentioned that chemical weed killers can no longer be used, and that the weeds would need to be pulled by hand or cut using a weed whacker. Councilman Ramant suggested that it could be arranged to have prisoners come for the cleanup.

REGULAR COMMITTEE REPORTS:

• Administrative: Frasier

Assessor/Justice Finance/Insurance – Town of Hague had a meeting with Mark Carpenter Agency on August 13, 2019 for the renewal policy. Recreation/ Promotion – the YMCA summer program is winding down for the

season. There were 16 kids in attendance this year.

• Buildings& Grounds: Fitzgerald/Patchett

-J. Patchett made mention that there is a section of pavement that needs to be repaired at the front entrance to the Town Community Center.

-Councilmen J. Patchett and M. Fitzgerald recently met at the landfill. The Councilmen discussed that it is unfortunate, but it is a consideration to get rid of the recycling bins at the transfer station for the time being. The Town of Hague has been accepting resident's recycling free of charge, while being charged a hauling fee from Casella to take the recycling off property. This has caused a large expense to the Town of Hague. The Councilmen stated that individuals could then take it upon themselves if they want to recycle. The second part of the plan would be to use a scale for all garbage as hauling fees are charged by weight. The Board is considering having two employees at the transfer station and/or installing a gate with a button to allow only one vehicle at a time to come through. ZEO Clark called a point of order that recycling is mandated in local law. The Board was in agreement that a plan needs to be established by the end of the year.

• Highway: Ramant/ Bast

-Councilman Ramant reported that work had been done on New Hague Road and Decker Hill Road. He states that the highway crew has also been helping out with raking at the Town Beach as there is only one remaining lifeguard.

• Museum/Historian: Patchett/ Ramant -The Hague Historical Society Meeting was cancelled for August.

• Personnel: Bast/Fitzgerald

-The Town of Hague Employee Manual revisions were added for the Town Board to review. Councilman Bast reported that he discussed the changes with Diane Trudeau, Confidential Secretary to the Supervisor.

• Planning/Zoning: Fitzgerald/Patchett

-The Town Board received a report from ZEO Clark with permit activity, updates on the Planning and Zoning Boards, and the status of sewer district hook-ups.

Town Park/Beautification: Ramant/Frasier

 Councilman Ramant reports that there have been three "Music in the Park" performances moved to the Community Center due to inclement weather this year, which is a new record.
 The Open House at the Community Center on August 5, 2019 for the Town Park Master Plan was well attended.
 An Invasive Species Meeting sponsored by the LGLC is scheduled for Thursday. August

-An Invasive Species Meeting sponsored by the LGLC is scheduled for Thursday, August 15, 2019 at 6:00 pm. A large turnout is expected.

• Sewer District#1 & #2: Bast/Frasier -Councilman Bast stated that the status of the sewer hookups was included with ZEO Clark's zoning report. Certified letters were mailed out to homeowners within the sewer districts that are not yet hooked up. There still has been no response from some of the property owners.

• Environmental Concerns: Ramant/ Patchett -Knotweed project is underway.

COMMUNICATIONS & PETITIONS:

-The Town of Hague received letters from Royal Anchorage Estates Homeowners Inc. and the Town of Putnam requesting the approval of two 5 MPH speed zone buoys to be installed between the shores of Royal Anchorage and Rock Brothers Island. Linda Barber, Director of Royal Anchorage, discussed the safety concerns of speeding boats. She states it is a danger for swimmers and boaters in small watercraft.

- The Town of Hague also received a letter from the Town of Dresden requesting the approval of four 5 MPH speed zone buoys to be installed in Indian Bay around Dunder Island. Dresden Town Supervisor, Paul Ferguson spoke on behalf of the request. He stated that there was recently an incident where a kayaker was hit by a speeding boat. He mentioned that boats are made to go much faster than they used to be.

-Both of these areas previously had put out speed zone buoys on their own. However, NYSDEC enforcement officers removed the buoys as they were not official. Because the waters of Lake George bordering the Towns of Putnam and Dresden lie within the jurisdiction of Warren County, NY, and specifically the Town of Hague, the resolutions for these requests must approved by the Town Board of the Town of Hague as per NYSDEC.

-Councilman Patchett expressed that he would like to do a site visit to get a visual understanding of both sites. Councilman Ramant made motion to table the resolutions until the next Town Board meeting. The Town Board agreed that they would plan a site visit together by boat. Supervisor Frasier stated the resolutions will be added to the agenda for September 10, 2019.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>:
