• <u>Planning Board</u>: meeting of January 2, 2014 was postponed until January 16th due to inclement weather. The board will review one application for Sketch Plan Review of a two lot subdivision and one application for a two lot subdivision.

- Zoning Board: meeting of December 19th. Starker, 8 fowler Lane, Variance for a landscape plan. The ZBA approved retaining walls grater than 4' in height and a raised patio which will be constructed within 50' of the lake.
- <u>Code Committee</u> At the meeting of January 9th the committee completed modification to Chapters 85 & 124 and has sent them to the Attorney for the Town and the Planning Board for their review and comments. They are still actively working of Travel Trailers and other areas of concern.
- Attached is a flyer from the APA for your information. It details the benefits of having a Local Land Approved Program.
- 8. Recreation & Promotion & Youth: (Ramant/Meola): Councilman Ramant reported that the Music in the Park schedule is complete for 2014. He will be in contact with the HITS Triathlon Representative to discuss the June 20 22, 2014 event.
- 9. Sewer District # 1 & 2: (Frasier/Kuenzel): Supervisor Frasier received the following report from the Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator. Plant Operations:
 - 1. 1 non-compliance events for Dec. for Nitrate as N in well. Limit is 10 mg/l we were 16.3 mg/l DEC was notified as required.
 - 2. Dec. 2013 flow up \sim 2% from Dec. 2012, Dec. 2013 flow \sim 5% higher than 6yr ave.
- 3. 2013 ave. flow up \sim 28% from 6 yr ave. , \sim 6% lower than 2012 Repairs:
 - 1. E-one Pumps
 - a. Currently have the following spare pumps in inventory.
 - i. (13) 2000 series pumps Dist. 1
 - ii. (1) 2000 series amgp (drop in septic tank)
 - iii. (3) extreme series pumps Dist. 2
 - iv. (2) extreme series amgp (1 new in box)
 - v. (1) Idu pump Dist. 2
 - b. (7) pumps in need of repair
 - i. (7) 2000 series dist. 1
 - c. Need to order parts for stock.
 - 2. Collection System
 - a. Vacuum air releases.
 - i. All inspected as of 3/29/13
 - 1. 38 inspected
 - 2. 21 not working
 - 3. 6 missing (most never installed)
 - 4. 11 working

Financial issues:

- 1. Streeter Hill Freeze up's
 - a. Work complete Approx. 12/31/13
 - b. Heat trace working well / checked weekly.

- 2. Comprehensive performance evaluation of WTTP & collection system to start 1/13/14.
- 3. Sludge disposal costs.
 - a. For 2012 we dried 37,661 gal of sludge in our drying beds and sent 21,840 gal of liquid sludge to Ticonderoga for disposal.
 - b. For 2013 we have sent 28,155 gal of sludge to our drying beds and sent 71,764 gal of liquid sludge to Ticonderoga for disposal.
 - c. So at approx. \$.10 / gal disposal and \$.08 for hauling we have spent about \$12,918 dollars on liquid sludge disposal, for this year.
- 4. Cape Cod Pump #1 Failed / New pump cheaper than rebuild / new pump ordered \$5,055.28 + freight.
 - a. This fail brought to light a problem with pump station alarms.
 - b. Working on quotes to fix problem (all 3 pump stations) and side stream pumps.
- 5. Digester Pumps lifting point failure.
 - a. Ordered replacement chain and clevises
 - b. Waiting on two more quotes for cleaning of digester and pump removal (permit required confined space entry required)
 - ii. 1st Quote is for \$19,357.91
 - iii. 2^{nd} Quote is for \$7,120
 - iv. 3rd Quote not received (after 3 phone calls)
 - c. Once pumps are removed we will be able to get a determination on if the pumps can be repaired (cost / part availability) or if they will have to be replaced.
- 6. Lab Chemical disposal
 - a. We have received 2 quotes for proper disposal.
- 7. E-1 pumps, we need to purchase 1 replacement pump for indoor units. We have 1 spare. They are different then the other E-1 pumps.
 - a. Cost is \$2153
- 8. We have implemented a new maintenance program/tracking system.
 - a. Progress is being made on maintenance items. We are falling behind on a few items.

- **4.** The Town Board discussed the proposal for Hague Boat Launch. The town needs to have a plan finalized by mid May due to the new LGPC regulations on having all boats inspected and tagged before enter Lake George. Councilman Ramant has been working with the state in hopes of finalizing an agreement with Rogers Rock to allow access without a fee to the residence. Supervisor Frasier would like the committee to write a proposal to the Town Board for their review. Once we have a document in place we can hold an Informational meeting.

ADDENDUM

1. Two quotes were received for cleaning of WWTP tank (pits). Clean Harbors with their operators doing the work: \$19,357.91 PSC will provide men & material to pump down tank on site to provide access for Hague WWTP to remove the pumps: \$3,560.00 per tank.

Motion by R. Meola, seconded by S. Ramant to accept PSC quote for cleaning of WWTP tanks in the amount of \$3,560.00 per tank. All voting yes. Motion carried.

2. Motion by R. Meola, seconded by M. Fitzgerald II to authorize the Supervisor to sign the Ticonderoga Youth Contract Agreement. The Agreement is for the period commencing 1/1/2014 to 12/31/2014 in the amount of \$1,000.00. All voting yes. Motion carried.

Councilman Ramant reported that Verizon wants to put a tower up in Gull Bay. This would help Hague residents will cell service. The Adirondack Park Agency is accepting written comments on this proposed project.

Councilwoman Kuenzel asked if there was a report from the Comprehensive committee. Supervisor Frasier and ZEO Cathy Clark explained that the problem is that many of the committee members are not available during the winter for meetings. Ms. Kuenzel suggested that new or additional members be added to the committee.
